


the formal launch of a brand new initiative in which we hope every household in Wadsworth will join us. We want to "**GREEN WADSWORTH!**"

The idea is to work together and raise our knowledge of what steps we can take to tackle climate change, reduce the damage we may be doing to the planet and save money in the process. **John Butterworth** is a lifelong resident of Pecket Well and a smallholder who has written over 100 articles for smallholding magazines, the first one published being about putting solar panels on your hen hut! He has been a campaigner for green energy and sustainability for years, so much so that Bernard Ingham called him the "Pecket Well Mafia!!" There's a claim for fame! In his professional life, he was a Product Manager and expert witness for BT before retiring.

He will be talking about "**Greener Energy? What** works, what doesn't? " John's talk aims to address these two issues in some detail. ## Greening Wadsworth



Do you ever get fed up with fretting about climate change and the damage us humans are doing to our planet? Apparently scientists say that this year, it's been the hottest in 120,000 years!! It certainly feels like it. Well, a group of us, so far the Community Centre, Wainsgate Chapel, members of the Environment Group, Old Town School and a small number of interested people who have heard about our initial thoughts on the grapevine, have come together with a very ambitious aim: To make Wadsworth the greenest Parish in Britain! None of us are experts (yet!) so we all plan to learn together and to encourage all 700+ households in Wadsworth to join us

on our journey to live more sustainably. We realise this is a long term project but we have started by setting six priorities for us to find out about and change if we can. These are:

Priority 1: Energy - This might include the installation of solar panels in the parish which might not save money for individuals though it would increase the supply of green energy in general. A possibility to be considered in future is the use of large agricultural buildings for solar panel placement. We also want to explore buying into a community energy supplier so save energy costs.



Priority 2: Insulation - We have applied for a grant from Northern Powergrid Net Zero Community Energy Fund 2023 to buy two Thermal Imaging camera apps so we can offer a service to all households to see where heat is being lost as a base line for better insulation and draught proofing. Fingers crossed we get the funds; if not, there will be some fund raising to do. We also plan to find out where money can be sourced to help people with any insulation costs and talk to the Housing Association about their position on insulation.

Priority 3: Food growing and eating - Jenny Slaughter, local Old Town resident, has been telling us about the Pennine Cropshare project she is involved in which provides weekly organic veg bags, delivered to the community centre as well as a new initiative to develop land behind Dodnaze for organic veg growing. We would like to raise awareness of the delights of growing your own veg, offer the small allotment at the centre to development and link home growers for food and tip swaps. Priority 4: Transport - While there is a pretty good bus service up to Pecket Well and Old Town it is dramatically under-used for most of the day. They withdrew the bike rack buses so it's hard to cycle both ways-that Keighley Road is a killer! We want to talk to the bus company TLC to see what we can do with them to improve use of the buses. We are also thinking public electric car and bike charging points (community sharing?) might be a way forward.

**Priority 5: Tree planting** - Tree planting is the simplest form of carbon capture and if we can identify suitable pieces of land for this, there may be grants available for the land owners and hopefully a team of community volunteers to plant them. Slow the Flow might be helpful too. Priority 6-Education - First we all need educating both about the damage to the planet we are contributing to and how we can live more sustainably. Second, we want to help Old Town School with their work to raise awareness of these issues and to tackle their hugely rising costs for energy and the challenges they face to insulate the school.

We hope you'll get involved. We want to do a guestionnaire for everyone in the Parish so we can get a baseline of where we are now and where we get to in the future. We hope you'll complete one. Please join us at our next meeting of Greening Wadsworth on Wednesday October 11th at 7.15pm at the Community Centre. We will be delighted to see you.

They will do this in a staged way so that use of the centre won't be disrupted. We expect the work to take about 8 weeks and hopefully you will enjoy the improved facilities. At the moment, there's a bus in the Hebden Bridge area—Pecket Well, Old Town that goes every Wednesday at about 9.00 a.m. and comes back at 11.00 a.m. to Tesco at Kings Cross. They some- times offer Sainsbury's as well. If you have a current bus pass it's free. If not, it's £3.00 each way. You normally have to book up each week in advance (not same day booking) but if you want to go every week then you don't have to re-book each time. Sounds brilliant.
