

Those of you who are regular visitors to our Post Office will know that Sarah and Alex have decided to move on from running the business but so far have had no luck in finding a buyer. To avoid losing the Post Office, shop and wonderful café as a precious local amenity, a group of local residents have formed Wadsworth Area Community Assets Limited which is a co-operative formed with the aim of ensuring the Post Office can continue to serve the community into the future.

Wadsworth Area Community Assets Limited is working closely with Sarah, Alex and family to ensure its smooth transition into community ownership. The co-operative is Not for Profit so any money earned is reinvested back into the business. It is currently managed by a small board of local volunteers, who offered to work on the initial phases. However the group hopes to attract more volunteers on working groups to take their aims for the Post Office forward in an open and transparent way by engaging as many people as possible.

First things first! The Community Assets company needs to raise funds to get the project of the ground and then to buy out the business. - Main Hall £15 per hour with a maximum charge of £75 per event
- Lounge £10 per hour with a maximum charge of £50 per event
- Whole Centre £20 per hour with a maximum charge of £100 per event
- Note that for parties with a bar an additional charge is made for cleaning (£25) and for a late license (currently £21) and you will be asked to pay a bond of £50 to cover any damage. This will be fully refunded after the event.
